How District Funds Are Allocated to Teaching and Learning

A school Superintendent has various roles and responsibilities to fulfill. One of the most essential functions of the Superintendency includes the oversight of the teaching and learning components in the various schools.

There are many components of teaching and learning, which impact schools. The most influential of these pieces is school funding. Every student in the state of Iowa comes with a dollar amount attached to him or her (i.e. combination of state funds and local tax dollars). This dollar amount for Woodward-Granger students happens to be \$6,591 for the 2017-18 school year. The chart below displays how a single student's local and state allocation is spent annually.

With approx. 950+ students (and growing) it is clear to see how student funding plays a vital role in the overall educational spending process. In particular lack of funding inhibits the ability of the district to funnel the appropriate dollars towards the areas of curriculum/software and technology. These areas are vital to assisting teachers in providing a world-class education.

On Tues. April 18th from 6-8 p.m. in the Elementary Media Center the district will host the second of two annual School Improvement Advisory Meetings (SIAC). These meetings are open to the general public and are required by law. SIAC groups are required to annually discuss the following items:

- Major educational needs.
- Student learning goals.
- Long-range and annual improvement goals that include, but are not limited to, the state indicators that address reading, mathematics, and science achievement.
- Desired levels of student performance.
- Progress toward meeting the goals set out in paragraphs "b" through "d".
- Harassment or bullying prevention goals, programs, training, and other initiatives.
- Consider recommendations to infuse character education into the educational program.

Please consider attending the SIAC meeting as we will discuss many of the above items and a few more. We hope to see you there!

District Does Well On 1st Department of Education Desk Audit

This fall the Department of Education launched a new program designed to hold district's accountable for various parts of the Iowa Code. The program was coined as the Desk Audit and consisted of a series of uploads to the DE site demonstrating not only the existence of such documents but also how information was communicated with the general public. Woodward-Granger received feedback from the Department that we met all compliances and did not need to create an extensive plan of action to fix non-compliance issues. Yahoo for WG!

High School

Beginning with the 2017 – 2018 school year students entering grade 7 and grade 12 must be vaccinated against meningococcal disease in order to attend school in the state of Iowa.

The change requires a one-time dose of meningococcal (A, C, W, Y) vaccine received on or after 10 years of age for applicants in grades 7 and above, if born after September 15, 2004; and 2 doses of meningococcal (A, C, W, Y) vaccines for applicants in grade 12, if born after September 15, 1999; or 1 dose if received when applicants are 16 years of age or older. This aligns with the recommendations by the national Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices.



- **One dose of meningococcal vaccine before seventh grade.** If a student had the first dose as a sixth grader, then another dose is not required until grade 12.
- A **total of two doses are required before grade 12.** Most students entering grade 12 received their first dose when they were younger and will be due for their second dose, or booster. This booster is needed because protection from the vaccine decreases over time.
- The **only teens that will NOT** need a second dose before grade 12 are those who received their first dose on or after their 16th birthday.

Parents are encouraged to check with their children’s physicians prior to the start of the new school year to determine when or if they need to be vaccinated. A valid Certificate of Immunization with the new meningococcal vaccine will need to be submitted to the school the child is enrolling or attempting to enroll. If you do not have insurance or your insurance does not pay for vaccines, contact Dallas County Public Health at 515-993-3750 or 515-465-2483.

Meningococcal disease is a severe bacterial infection that can lead to meningitis (inflammation of the lining covering the brain and spinal cord) and bloodstream infections such as septicemia. Symptoms of the disease include a high fever, headache, vomiting, a stiff neck and a rash. Those who contract the disease may experience permanent brain damage, hearing loss, kidney failure, loss of arms or legs, or chronic nervous system problems.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has found the highest rates of meningococcal disease to be among preteens, teens, and young adults, as well as among infants with certain medical conditions. The new law targets many in this age group and aligns with the CDC’s recommendation to vaccinate 11- to 18-year-olds against meningococcal disease.

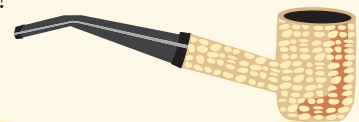
Woodward-Granger Drama Department presents:

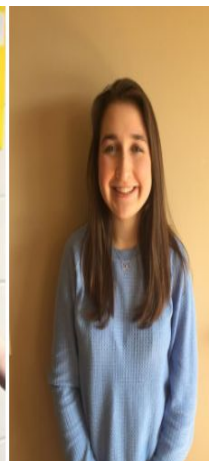
2017 Speech Recap

Large Group Speech kicked off competition season in January. We took 13 groups to district competition, where 7 of the groups qualified for state. At state competition, we had strong results, which eventually led to one improv group qualifying for All-State. Elizabeth Weyers and Alexis Bixler were recognized at Iowa State in February for their outstanding performance.

Individual Speech began right after district Large Group competition. Individual district competition was late in February, and we took 23 students in 34 events. Of these, 17 events qualified for state competition. At state, 11 events earned division 1 ratings, and 3 events moved on to qualify for All-State. 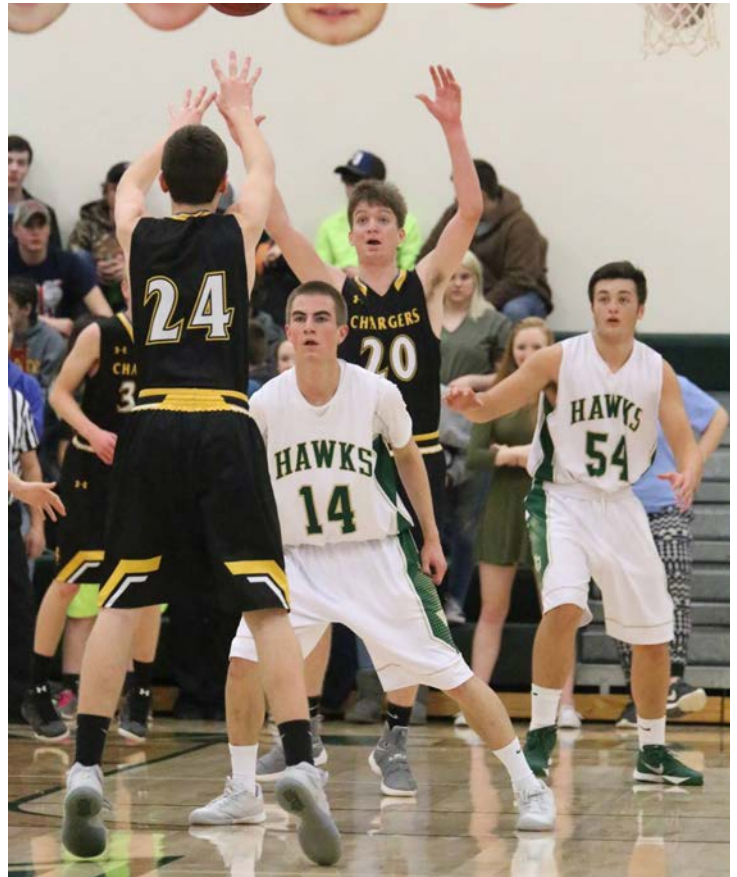
Basketball wrap up. Team finished overall record of 9-13, tied for 5th in conference 7-11. 4 players voted all conference.

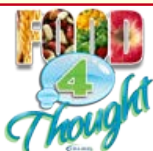
