WGEA receives ISEA Grant for W-G Community Pantry

Back in November, Kendra Spoelstra (Woodward-Granger Education Association Co-President and Elementary SPED teacher) along with Jenna Tweeten (ELC & Elementary Counselor) and Alex Blum (ELC & Elementary Nurse) began working on applying for one of the Iowa State Education Association's (ISEA) Community Outreach Grants available in February totalling \$500. WGEA selected to work on the grant with Mrs. Tweeten and Mrs. Blum as they are in charge of the Woodward-Granger Community Pantry, which is currently serving about 20 families within the Woodward-Granger School District, thanks to all of the products that they have received from the Food Bank of Iowa. The need for students in the community was high in regards to needing meals at home and snacks at school. The schools have been seeing a high response level from students that they were not eating full meals unless they were receiving those meals at school, through school breakfast and lunch. Unfortunately, this meant that the typical "backpack program" with weekend snacks that were sent home was no longer sufficient to meet the needs of those students. The W-G Community Pantry began to address this need, and is now able to send bagged snacks home for students. The pantry is also open twice a

month for families, as well as being available for families to set appointment time to come in and take items home. The access to the pantry is very family friendly, and is currently serving about 30 students at the elementary level and expanding to the middle school and high school as well. The use of the pantry is expected to continue to grow as word gets out about this service and program provided within our community.

With this grant money, WGEA was looking for ways to help grow this program, while still maintaining the safety of the foods as well as the ease of delivery of the foods at school. WGEA is hoping to help the pantry purchase more shelving to store their food items, carts to help safely deliver the food to the students and families, and hot/cold bags to be able to send refrigerated items home. On March 1st, WGEA received a letter from ISEA stating that we had been selected as one of the local associations to receive a \$500 Community Outreach Grant. We are very pleased to have been selected and to be able to give this money to such a worthy cause that benefits so many of our students for which we serve.

The High School boys basketball team finished the season with a 15-10 record after losing to state runner up Treynor in a substate basketball game They won the District 16 championship over Des Moines Christian 66-63 to earn their spot in the substate final. Their 9 - 9 conference record was good enough for a 6th place finish in the West Central Conference. The JV Hawks finished the season with a 5-6 record and the Fresh/Soph team went 5-11. Sophomore Keith Braunschweig and senior JP Nixon earned Honorable Mention all conference honors while Sophomore Bryce Achenbach earned 1st team all conference recognition. Achenbach was also named to the All Substate 8 Team. The 15 wins were the most by a WG team going back to 2000.

Girls Basketball

The 2017-18 girls basketball season was an up and down one for the Hawks. Unfortunately the theme for the season was "it is difficult to score". The team averaged 34.4 points a game, scoring in the 50's only once and the 40's just five times in 23 games, while finishing 4-19 overall and 1-15 in the West Central Conference.

The girls did a nice job of staying focused and practicing hard. Our skills improved as the season went on and we gave ourselves many chances to win games. With only 12 team members and just two seniors and two juniors, the team was relatively young, especially in comparison to many of the teams we faced. Hopefully this team can continue to grow and improve and become one with many experienced upperclassmen rather than just a few. That combined with continued hard work to improve individual skills through off-season workouts could lead to a much improved season next year for those players that return.

Seven of the twelve players reached the criteria to earn a varsity letter. They are: Seniors Alyssa Bice and Kaitlyn Peters; Juniors Kayley Dresback and Lisa Pitman; Sophomores Mae Anderson, Natalie Helbling, and Katelyn Scharlau. Other team members: Sophomores Quinn Kaufman, Maddie Danti and Chloe David; Freshmen Faith Kuehl and Ava Petersen.

Two players were recognized by the conference coaches as Honorable Mention All-Conference: Alyssa Bice and Kayley Dresback.

2018 Individual Events Speech Recap

This year, the Woodward-Granger Speech team had a fantastic Individual Events competition season. We had 20 students perform in 32 events at district competition in February. Of those, 19 events, performed by 14 students, went on to state competition in March. State competition was the most successful competition we've had in recent history. 10 of the events earned straight division I ratings, which is the highest possible rating. We had 5 other events earn overall Is and had 4 events that earned a division II rating.

The top performers at state competition are nominated by judges for performance rights at the All-State Festival at UNI. This year, we have 4 students who qualified for All-State honors.



In an effort to deepen student understanding of chemistry concepts and to increase interest in science, high school chemistry teacher, Ms. Piatz and middle school science teacher, Mrs. Nygaard, collaborated on a cooperative learning project. The high school chemistry class was given the task of creating a short lesson and/or activity on either the Periodic Table & Atoms or Chemical & Physical Change that was suitable for a 6th grade science class. The real inspiration behind this collaboration project came from the chemistry students. What made this assignment great was the willingness of some of the chemistry students to make the extra effort to take their project into the 6th grade classroom. This was an exemplary example of the character, motivation, and perseverance of some of our Woodward-Granger High School students.

Research shows that students learn content significantly better through cooperative group learning and peer learning. These high school students rose to the occasion to demonstrate just that. Each individual or group worked tirelessly on practicing and perfecting their activities by

coming in before school, after school, and during their open or study hall periods. The students did an excellent job presenting their lesson and activity. The 6th grade students loved having the high school students in the classroom and were actively engaged in activities relative to their current unit of study.


These exemplary students and their projects are as follows:


Elementary
