This year the district has changed the process and will be conducting online registration through our Infinite Campus student management system. Doing this will mean less paper for everyone and will provide a quick and easy process for both returning and new students to the district.

On Tuesday April 18th from 6-8 p.m. in the elementary media center the Woodward-Granger CSD will host its Spring School Improvement Advisory meeting. 
