

Government Class

On February 11th, the Woodward Granger High School government class was able to attend a live session of the Iowa Supreme Court to listen to oral arguments in the case of Lemartec Engineering v. Advance Conveying Technologies. Students were able to sit in and listen in on the case as attorneys presented their arguments about who is at fault and should pay to fix the defects of a building in Eddyville, IA. While the case will take weeks or possibly months to finally be settled, it was a great chance for our students to see our judicial branch live in action. Following the court case, we met

with Senior Judge David Danilson who discussed his career as a Circuit Court of Appeals Judge and now Senior Judge for the court systems. Students were able to ask questions and talk with Judge Danilson about what it takes to get to his position. Finally, we were given a tour of the lowa Supreme Court building where students were able to see where court cases are heard on a daily basis and hear about the history of some famous court cases here in lowa. It was a great opportunity for our students, and we look forward to doing it in the future!

Not only does she put so much care and research into her art, but she is also willing to help and advise others.



ELC and Elementary Receive Special Recognition for Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports Program

The Iowa Department of Education has awarded Woodward-Granger Early Learning Center and Elementary the Honor Plus Level of Recognition for their implementation of Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) in the 2018 - 2019 school year.

PBIS is a tried and proven framework that is centered on social behavior and is made up of three tiers. At the ELC and Elementary our three school-wide expectations are Respectful, Responsible, and Safe - Living with HAWK Pride. This framework provides consistent language, consistent expectations from all staff in each area of the school and the use of positive language. We want to be as proactive in heading off problem behaviors as we can instead of being reactive to them. We are excited to receive this recognition and will continue working hard to provide a safe and positive school environment.


