The Second Grade Scoop

The Fifth grade Art ELP students have been meeting on Tuesday afternoons to study about native Iowa plants and animals. The group of 15 fifth graders, who are very talented in visual art and interested in science, were invited to join the ELP class. They have made sketches of Oxley Creek and it's banks, they have studied about monarch butterflies and their migration to Mexico each fall, and they have looked for information about native Iowa plants online.

Mrs. Kruger, the PK-5th grade art teacher, wanted to continue the ELP Art program this year as an after school class. She chose Iowa plants & animals as the theme so that she & the ELP Art students could plant a butterfly garden near Oxley Creek and beautify the area after the creek was re-channeled last year.

The ELP Art students planted some milkweed seeds in planters in February, but only 2 seeds sprouted. They are now applying for some free milkweed plants from Monarch Watch. Monarch Watch is a cooperative organization of students, teachers, volunteers and researchers that is dedicated to the study of Monarch Butterflies and helping them continue to thrive. Monarchs have been declining in number in recent years, due to lack of habitat.

Mrs. Kruger and the fifth graders would like the banks of Oxley Creek to become a Monarch Waystation, so they are making a map of a butterfly garden, pricing fences and sketching native Iowa plant life in their sketchbooks. With support from Mr. Anderson, Mr. Brummond, & Mrs. Kruger, this group of young artists will soon create what they have sketched about all winter!

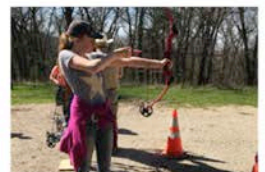
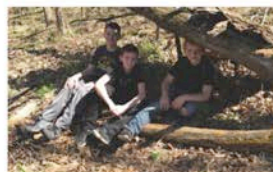
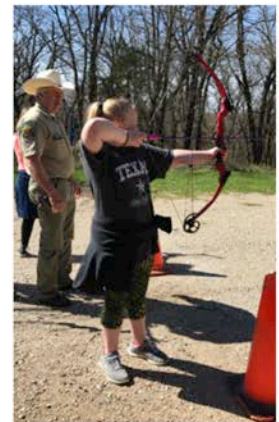
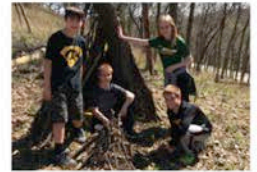
6th Grade to Springbrook State Park

Despite the Springbrook Educational Center closing its doors due to funding this spring, the State Park still offers some outdoor programming. The W-G 6th grade class was able to have an educational, fun-filled day of survival activities. Monday, April 17th, was a beautiful day to be enjoying the outdoors, especially as we walked about 6 miles throughout the day, to and from our activities!

The 6th grade students enjoyed the challenge of some new skills as they rotated through four different stations. Students were able to test their skills in archery. Everyone did a great job of following directions and many hit the targets on their first try. The students also worked together in small groups to build shelters in the woods. They were asked to use materials on the ground to build

a shelter that one person or your whole group could spend the night in. While thinking about possible weather conditions and their cardinal directions, they were asked to justify how they chose to build their shelters. The kids should also be ready for camping season, as they all were able to build a campfire in their groups. The fourth session was GPS. They learned how to use a GPS unit and used it to find 3-4 waypoints in the woods and meet back at the starting points. Only a few students got off course, but don't worry, we didn't leave anyone behind.

Springbrook is one Iowa's wonderful state parks, that isn't too far away. The 6th grade students had a great time on their field trip and would certainly recommend we go again.

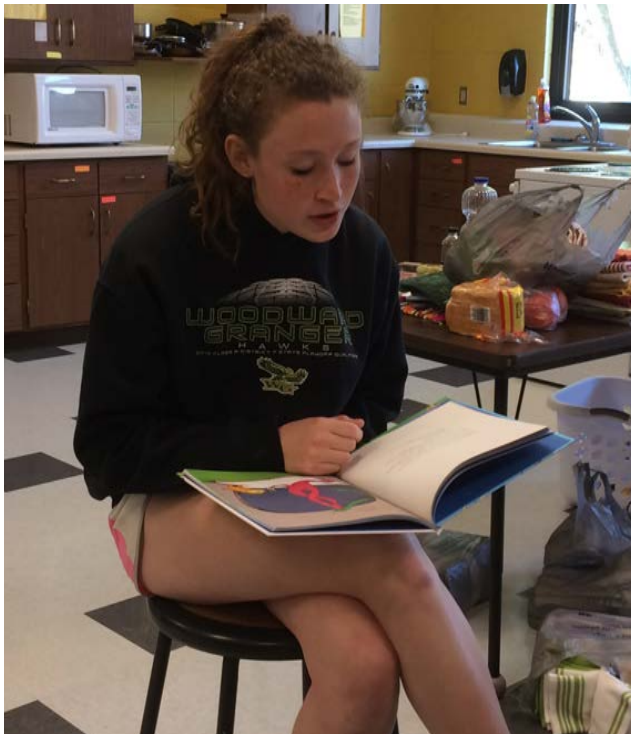


High School

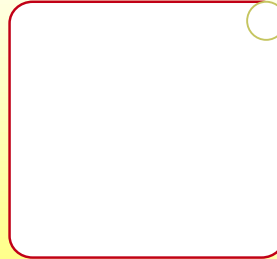
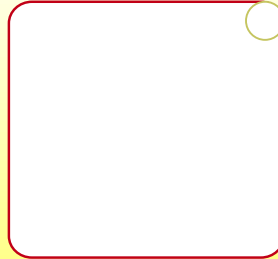

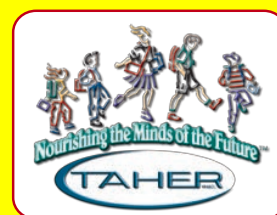
