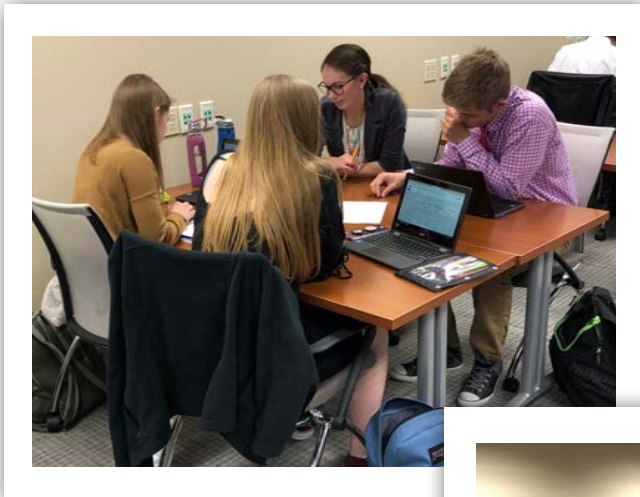
High School

At the end of March, all students in the spring classes of Personal Finance participated in the Iowa Economic Council's Personal Finance Challenge. This challenge was set up as a 30 question online assessment and I organized the students into teams of four. If a team's score (best 3 scores), finished in the top 5 in our geographic region, they would qualify for the state competition. Having never participated in the event before and that the students were only halfway through the course I wasn't sure how any team would do, but I was thoroughly impressed with the overall results and one of our teams did in fact qualify for the state competition! Woodward-Granger was represented by Sophie David, Josie Noland, Lisa Pitman and Cole Theisen on April 10 at the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago office in West Des Moines.

The state competition consisted of a variety of 20 schools around the state and each team was tasked with coming up with their financial recommendations for a family scenario. The groups were asked to act as the family's financial advisors and then they had to pitch their solutions/

recommendations to a panel of judges. Topics that were to be addressed included: retirement, college planning, taxes, insurance, budgeting, savings and others. Each team had an hour to read through the family scenario and to prepare their solution. Teachers were just allowed to watch and I really enjoyed seeing the students work together as a team, be creative, become problem solvers and demonstrate a high level of character and professionalism during the experience. I was very proud of how they represented Woodward-Granger. In the end, our students finished 9th in the competition, and I was extremely impressed due to the fact that some of the topics had not been introduced to the students in the classroom yet. It was a great opportunity for our students to experience a real world, problem solving experience that required them to put their knowledge to the test! I am looking forward to seeing more of our Personal Finance students have the opportunity again next year!

E-Book Access over the Summer

Over the summer they will be able to continue reading ebooks and listening to audiobooks through Clever, an app that allows students to log in to Mackin and check out ebooks. Use the link <https://clever.com/in/wghawks> to get to Clever. Students may log in with their Google login information, then click on the Mackin button. The link to Clever can also be found on the district website (www.wghawks.school).

Middle School and High School students can access Mackin through Destiny, our online catalog (www.wg.follettdestiny.com). Log in using first name last name as the username, with no spaces. Their password is the 5 digit student number they use in Infinite Campus and lunch accounts. For example:

Username: JohnSmith

Password: 12345

Once they have logged into Destiny, they will have the option to open and read any ebooks that are displayed in their search results.

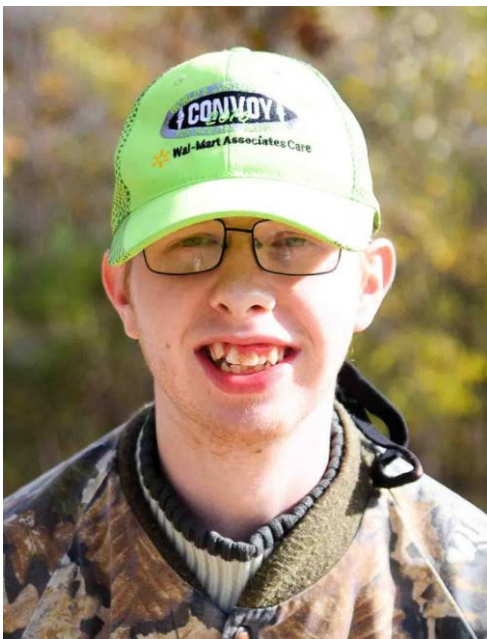

Box Tops for Education

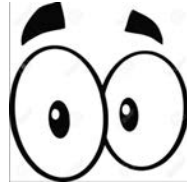

Summer is almost here and it's time to schedule our children's annual appointments and physicals. Here is what you need to know and have updated before returning to school in the fall.

Immunizations: Per state law you must have these immunizations prior to starting school in the fall.

Students entering 7th grade must have a Tdap vaccination booster AND a meningococcal vaccination on or after 10 years of age.

Students entering 12th grade must show proof of receiving 2 DOSES of meningococcal vaccine; or 1 DOSE if first dose was received after 16 years of age.

Vision:

Vision screen for Kindergarten and 3rd grade students. Please provide proof of this to the school nurse.

Dental:

Dental screen for Kindergarten and 9th grade students. Please provide form to the school nurse.

On Friday, April 27th four of our fastest (we timed them!) athletes will run in the 4X100M relay against other Special Olympic athletes from around the state. What a privilege to be selected as one of the only teams from our state!

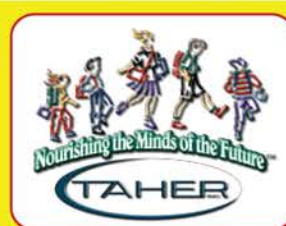
