



New overdue policy at the MS/HS Library

The HS/HS library will no longer charge a daily fee for overdue books. All books are still due 2 weeks after they are checked out. If they are not returned in time, students will receive a reminder by email. If they are still not returned a month after the due date, students will be charged the cost of replacing the book and parents will be notified. Students always have the option to bring the book in to renew if they have not finished it and need more time.

Scholastic Book Fair Coming! The Scholastic Book Fair will again be in the Elementary School Library during conference week. Students will have the opportunity to preview the fair the week before, and the fair will be open for business November 6 & 8 from 3:30 p.m.-7:45 p.m. Teachers will have wish baskets set up if you would like to purchase a book for their classroom libraries, and their choices are often a good guide to what your children might like to read as well.

Each year Grandwood students enjoy a CLE in the fall to Deals Orchard in Jefferson. This CLE provides students with many learning experiences such as social interaction, the process of making cider, growing Christmas trees and much more.

All classrooms pick out a big pumpkin from the patch, apples and cider for their room, and the students each gets a smaller pumpkin.

Disk Golf

During PE this month, at Grandwood, the students learned how to play disc golf. The Mocarski family donated one disc golf goal and 13 discs to Grandwood Learning Center. We worked on putting skills. Then we worked on throwing using forehand and backhand throws. We learned that after we throw from the launch pad, the person furthest from the goal goes next. Whom ever gets the disc in the basket on the goal in the fewest throws goes first on the next hole. Once the students had mastered some of the basic skills, they were ready to play. We borrowed five more goals from the middle school and played a 6 hole course. The next time we had PE we made the distance between holes much further apart. The students did a great job. They kept score, played by the rules and encouraged each other. Now they have a skill they can use when hanging out with friends and family outside of school. We are hoping to try playing on a real course for one of our future Community Learning Experiences.
