New overdue policy at the MS/HS Library

## Deals Orchard Pumpkin Patch

Each year Grandwood students enjoy a CLE in the fall to Deals Orchard in Jefferson. This CLE provides students with many learning experiences such as social interaction, the process of making cider, growing Christmas trees and much more.

All classrooms pick out a big pumpkin from the patch, apples and cider for their room, and the students each gets a smaller pumpkin.

Students are able to take part in many different activities offered by the Orchard. Students can enjoy a hay ride, the corn maze, pedal tractors, goat races, the jumping pillow, giant slides, the corn pool and more.

The students at Grandwood took a survey on what their favorite activity is at Deals Orchard.

1. Jumping Pillow
2. Giants Slides
3. Hay Rack Ride
4. Pumpkin Picking
5. Corn Pool

During PE this month, at Grandwood, the students learned how to play disc golf. The Mocarski family donated one disc golf goal and i3 discs to Grandwood Learning Center. We worked on putting skills. Then we worked on throwing using forehand and backhand throws. We learned that after we throw from the launch pad, the person furthest from the goal goes next. Whom ever gets the disc in the basket on the goal in the fewest throws goes first on the next hole. Once the students had mastered some of the basic skills, they were ready to play. We borrowed five more goals from the middle school and played a 6 hole course. The next time we had PE we made the distance between holes much further apart. The students did a great job. They kept score, played by the rules and encouraged each other. Now they have a skill they can use when hanging out with friends and family outside of school. We are hoping to try playing on a real course for one of our future Community Learning Experiences.
