HAWK HAPPENINGS

At the beginning of every school year there is a lot of discussion centered on establishing goals for the upcoming year. Parents give careful consideration to the goals they have for the children as they enter a new school year. Teachers are focused on establishing a learning community that supports the needs of every child in their classroom. Likewise, principals evaluate the overall condition of learning and develop plans for continuous improvement within their buildings. Even the board of education spends time discussing what they want to accomplish in a new academic year. November is a great time of year to pause and reflect on the progress of our goals and ensure efforts are aligned to the priorities we established at the beginning of the year. The Woodward-Granger Board of Directors worked closely with the Iowa Association of School Boards to identify our goals for the 2019-2020 school year.

Board Goal A: Cultivating support that ensures strong, successful student learning

To accomplish this goal, learning must become personalized for each and every student. It becomes personalized when teachers know what students can and can't do in the classroom and respond with appropriate and timely instruction. This demanding work can not be done in isolation. Teachers organize themselves in professional learning communities (PLC) and develop common formative assessments to conduct frequent checks for understanding. This allows for a flexible, responsive approach to teaching and learning. To be successful in this endeavor, principals and teachers must participate in a continuous improvement cycle to grow the knowledge and skills necessary to meet the individual needs of all students.

Board Goal B: Growing a culture of ongoing development of staff

Our greatest asset as a school district is our staff and faculty. We have a lot of talented educators currently in our system. Additionally, we need to continue to attract other talented educators to join our district and contribute to our efforts in becoming a premier school district in the metro area. Retaining our talent is equally important. We want to make sure we provide staff with the resources and supports necessary to do their jobs at high levels. Resources and supports can come in the form of supplies and materials, professional development or even emotional support. I believe teaching is the toughest job on the planet and we need to make sure we are recruiting and retaining a talented workforce to meet the demands of the job.

Board Goal C: Exploring, prioritizing and implementing programs to meet the full range of student needs

In today's schools we are preparing students for jobs that currently do not exist. We need to expose our students to a wide variety of experiences and opportunities. When we consider 'building futures one student at a time' we must recognize every student may choose a different path to that future. The challenge is providing programming that meets the needs of students regardless of the chosen path. In preparation of our changing, dynamic society we must provide programming that will enhance their experience beyond high school.


Board Goal D: Advancing a strong community-school partnership (emphasis on strengthening trust)

ARTIST SPOTLIGHT


The spotlight is on Jenae Jones!

6th Grade Bike Ride

How does 80 6th grade students and 10 adults all on bikes at one time on the High Trestle Trail sound to you? For Woodward-Granger Middle School, it sounds like an annual fun time! On October 4th, the 6th grade teachers, along with parent volunteers, took a bike trip with the 6th grade class from W-G middle school all the way to Madrid and back. The total trip was 13 miles - maybe the farthest some of these kids (and adults!) have ever biked in one day!

6th grade math teacher Katie Nygaard is the mastermind behind the trip. She has done this bike ride every year since she has been at W-G. The bike ride promotes outdoor recreation on one of the best bike trails in the state of lowa, healthy activity, and proper biking etiquette on a trail along with safety. Thankfully, we had parent volunteers at each road passing to help direct students and traffic making for a safe ride.

The students stopped at the overlook of the river (pictures attached) for a group picture, and then again in Madrid for a snack and hydration. We made it back in time for the end of the school day where we loaded all the bikes to be transported back to the elementary for kids who live there to be picked up while Woodward students were picked up at the middle school. 2nd Grade Butterfly Garden

The second-grade teachers were the lucky recipients of a \$500 grant from the W-G Foundation last fall. Our grant proposal was written for money to be used for a field trip to watch a play about butterflies and to design and construct a butterfly garden for the second graders (and butterflies!) to enjoy. Due to the weather last spring, we had to put our plans on hold. This past summer the teachers designed and constructed the garden and the students have enjoyed watching the many butterflies come and enjoy the flowers. One day we counted 15 out there at once! We are extremely fortunate to have received this and will be able to enjoy it for many years to come.

This is our second year raising Monarch caterpillars from egg to adult and we have been very successful. We have loved watching the tiny caterpillars hatch from their eggs and go through all the stages in their metamorphosis as we fed them milkweed. The students watched the chubby caterpillars change into their emerald green chrysalis and then emerge as beautiful butterflies. We have learned so much about these insects and hope that we can help to rebuild their population.
